These Guidelines relate to income eligibility for the following programs:

- ARSeniors: Equal to or Below 80%
- Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB) = 100% Poverty / Resource Limit = \$4000 (I), \$
- Special Low Income Medicare Beneficiary (SLMB) = 120% Poverty / Resource Limit
- Commodities Distribution Program = 130% Poverty / Resource Limit = None
- Weatherization programs = 125% Poverty / Resource Limit = None
- Qualified Individual #1 = 135% Poverty Resource Limits = \$4,000 (I), \$6,000 (C)
- Title V Older Worker Program = 125% Poverty Resources = None
- Working Disabled = 250% (For each additional family member in the Working Disabled \$750.00)

NOTE: State Older Worker Program limits are based
on 200% SSI not on Poverty Guidelines.
